

This course also help to learn and understand the different methods of doing philosophy, understanding their significance and

applying them in the relevant areas.

At the end of the programme the students are expected to learn the research methodology and to apply them validly while writing research papers. While donning so they are expected to consult both the primary and the secondary sources of books and also to study research articles both contemporary and modern.



Course Outcomes



In this paper students will gathered their information such as Innate Ideas, Simple and Complex Ideas, Substance, Modes and relations, Nature of knowledge and its degrees, Limits of knowledge, Primary and Secondary Qualities, Representative realism of Lockes philosophy And Berkeley's Abstract Ideas, Criticism of Locks Distinction between Primary and Secondary Qualities and his famous theory of Essest- Percipi. And They become acquainted with Hume and Kant philosophy like Knowledge, Idea, judgements, theory of causation of Hume and they able to distinguish between a priori and a posteriori judgments; Distinction between Analytic and Synthetic Judgments, Copernican Revolution Metaphysical and Transcendental Exposition of Space & Camp; Time of Kant Philosophy.

Course Outcomes



PHILHCC9: PSYCHOLOGY


Course Outcomes

PHILHCC12: PHILOSOPHICAL ANALYSIS-1


